THE VETERINARY ACT (REGISTRATION OF VETERINARIANS AND VETERINARY PRACTICE FACILITIES) RULES, 2004

PART I PRELIMINARY

Citation

1. These Rules may be cited as the Veterinary Surgeons (Registration of Veterinarians and veterinary practice facilities) Rules, 2004.

Application

2. These Rules shall apply to all Veterinarians who wish to practice in Tanzania Mainland.

Interpretation

- 3. In these Rules unless otherwise requires:-
- "Council" means a Council Veterinary of Tanzania established under the Veterinary Act;
- "certificate of registration" includes certificate of registration of veterinarian and certificate of registration of veterinary practice facility;
- "examiner" means a person or institution appointed by the Council to conduct examinations under rule 16;
- "Foreign Trained Veterinarian" means a Tanzanian veterinarian who acquired veterinary qualification from recognized institution outside the United Republic; or
- "Foreign Veterinarian" means a veterinarian who is not a citizen of the United Republic:
- "holder" means a holder of certificate of registration issued under these Rules;
- "Inspector" means a veterinary ethics and practice inspector designated as such under these rules;
- "Locally trained Veterinarian" means a Tanzanian veterinarian who acquired veterinary qualification in the recognized institutions within the United Republic:
- "Ordinance" means the Veterinary Surgeons Ordinance;
- "Registrar" means the Registrar of the Council appointed under the Act;

"Veterinary practice facility" is any established premise, structure or ambulatory vehicle where any animal is attended as defined under veterinary practice.

"Veterinary practice" means directly or indirectly the diagnoses, prognoses, treatment, administering to, prescribing for, operations on, manipulations of appliances or any apparatus or appliance for any disease, pain, deformity, defect, injury, wound or physical or mental condition of any animal or for the prevention of, or to test for the presence of any disease of any animal and includes acts related to statutory or compliance functions.

PART II PROCEDURE FOR REGISTRATION OF VETERINARIAN

Requirement to register

- **4.**-(1) Any person being a veterinarian shall, before engaging himself in veterinary practice in Tanzania, be required to obtain registration under these Rules.
- (2) Subject to section 15 of the Act, no person shall be allowed to practice as a veterinarian in Tanzania Mainland unless he is registered as such under these Rules.

Application forms

- **5.-**(1) Application under these Rules shall be made in prescribed forms to be obtained from the Registrar, and the application fee shall be:
 - (a) in case of foreign veterinarian upon payment of one hundred US Dollars or equivalent in Tanzanian Shillings; and
 - (b) in case of foreign trained veterinarian and locally trained veterinarian upon payment of ten thousand shillings.
 - (2) Any payment made under sub-rule (1) shall not be refundable.

Application for registration

- **6.**-(1) A Veterinarian who wishes to obtain registration under these Rules shall submit a formal application to the Registrar.
- (2) An application made under sub-rule (1) shall be in the form prescribed in the first schedule to these Rules and shall contain.
 - (a) personal particulars of the applicant;
 - (b) academic qualifications;
 - (c) institutions attended;
 - (d) names and addresses of two referees;
 - (e) any other information as may be required.

Certificates and other documents

- **7.-**(1) An applicant under these Rules shall, in addition to application forms be required to attach certified copies of certificates and such other documents as may be required.
- (2) The Registrar may, if he is not satisfied with copies of certificates submitted by an applicant, require the applicant to submit original certificates for perusal.

Reference of matter to the Council

- **8.** The Registrar shall, after scrutinizing the application forms, relevant certificates and other documents as submitted by the applicant under these Rules.
 - (a) make recommendations in respect of the applicant; and
 - (b) prepare and present to the Council a brief report containing:
 - (i) personal particulars and other information of the applicant;
 - (ii) recommendations made under paragraph (a).

Registration fee

- **9.**-(1) An applicant shall upon registration, be required to pay -
- (a) in case of foreign veterinarian a registration fee of two hundred US Dollar; and
- (b) in case of foreign trained veterinarian and locally trained veterinarian a registration fee of twenty thousand Shillings.

Retention fee

- **10.-**(1) A Veterinarian granted a certificate of registration under these Rules shall be required to pay annually a retention fee -
 - (a) in case of foreign veterinarian one hundred US Dollar or equivalent in Tanzanian Shillings;
 - (b) in case of foreign trained veterinarian and locally trained veterinarian ten thousand shillings.
- (2) Where a veterinarian fails to pay a retention fee without a good cause, the Council may instruct the Registrar to remove the name of such veterinarian from the register book.

Publication of registered veterinarians

11. The Registrar shall after registration of veterinarians cause to be published annually in the Gazette the names, addresses and academic qualification of all registered veterinarians under these Rules.

PART III REGISTRATION OF FOREIGN VETERINARIANS AND FOREIGN TRAINED VETERINARIANS

Requirement for foreign Veterinarians

- **12.** The applicant who is a foreign veterinarian shall, in addition to application form, be required to submit -
 - (a) copies of original certificates in respect of his academic qualification;
 - (b) copies of degree transcript;
 - (c) a copy of certificate of registration issued by a professional regulatory body from the country of origin;
 - (d) copies of work and resident permit;
 - (e) name and address of referee from institution from which he acquired academic qualification as a veterinarian and from a professional regulatory body of the country of origin; and
 - (f) any other documents as may be necessary.

Requirement for foreign trained veterinarian

- **13.-**(1) An applicant who is a foreign trained veterinarian shall, in addition to his application form be required to submit to the Registrar -
 - (a) a copy of original certificates in respect of his academic qualification;
 - (b) a copy of degree transcripts;
 - a copy of certificate of registration if any, issued by a professional regulatory body from the country in which the veterinarian is registered;
 - (d) letters of referees from the Institution attended and from a professional regulatory body under paragraphs (c); if any; and
 - (e) any other documents as may be required.

Application forms to be scrutinized

14. The Registrar shall after receiving the application forms and attached documents from the applicant under rules 12 and 13, scrutinize the documents to ensure availability and authenticity of all documents and information.

PART IV EXAMINATIONS AND GRANT OF REGISTRATION

Determination by the Council

- **15.**-(1) In determining the matter presented before it by the Registrar in respect of foreign veterinarian and foreign trained veterinarian, the Council may, if it is satisfied with particulars of the applicant, order that certain Veterinary examination to the applicant be conducted prior to registration.
- (2) The Council may where it is not satisfied with the particulars and other information of the applicant -
 - (a) instruct the Registrar to require more information or document as may be required from the applicant, or
 - (b) refuse an application and instruct the Registrar to notify the applicant accordingly stating the reasons for the decision of the Council.

Examination to the applicant

- **16.**-(1) The Council shall, where the examination is to be conducted to the applicant under sub-rule (1) of rule 15 appoint the examiner and instruct the Registrar-
 - (a) to schedule and facilitate the conduct of examinations; and
 - (b) to notify both the applicant and the examiner accordingly.
- (2) The applicant shall upon payment of examination fee as may be determined by the Council, be required to sit for examination and pass the examination to the satisfaction of the Council.
- (3) The examiner shall, immediately after the examination correct the paper and submit the results to the Registrar.

Results to be submitted to the

17.-(1) The Registrar shall after receiving the examination results from the examiner refer the matter to the Council for determination.

Council

- (2) Where the applicant has passed the examination to the satisfaction of the Council, then the Council shall, instruct the Registrar -
 - (a) to register the applicant upon payment of such registration fee as may be prescribed;
 - (b) to issue certificate of registration to the applicant.

Certificates of registration

- **18.** The Certificate of registration issued to the applicant under rule 17 shall be in the form prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Rule and shall contain:
 - (a) names and address of the holder;
 - (b) qualification or title of the holder;
 - (c) such terms and conditions as may be preferred by the Council to be observed by the holder of certificate.

Validity of certificate of registration Failure to satisfy the Council

- **19.** The certificate of registration issued under this Part shall be valid as long as the annual retention fee is paid, and shall be subject to renewal after 5 years to such other period upon application by the holder.
- **20.**-(1) Where the examination results of the applicant are not satisfactory to the Council, the Council shall instruct the Registrar to notify the applicant accordingly.
- (2) Unsuccessful applicant may apply for a second opportunity to sit for examinations upon payment of examination fee as may be prescribed:

Provided that an applicant shall not be allowed to sit for examination for more than two times.

Exemption from Examination

21. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Part the Council shall have power to exempt certain category of applicants or individual applicant from sitting for examination prior to registration.

PART V REGISTRATION OF LOCALLY TRAINED VETERINARIANS

Requirement for locally trained veterinarian

- **22.** An applicant who is a locally trained veterinarian shall, in addition to the application form be required to submit:
 - (a) copies of certificates in respect of his academic qualification;
 - (b) a copy of degree transcript; and
 - (c) any other documents as may be required.

Certificate of registration for locally trained veterinarian

- 23.-(1) The Council shall,
- (a) where it is satisfied with particulars and other information of the applicant under Rule 22 instruct the Registrar -
 - (i) to register the applicant; and
 - (ii) to issue a certificate of registration upon payment of registration fee as may be prescribed; or
- (b) where it is not satisfied with the particulars of the applicant,

refuse an application and instruct the Registrar to enquire for more information from the applicant before his registration.

(2) A Certificate of registration issued to the applicant under this rule may contain such terms and conditions as may be determined by the Council to be observed by the holder.

PART VI PROCEDURE FOR REGISTRATION OF VETERINARY PRACTICE FACILITIES

Requirement to register the facility

24.-(1) A veterinarian shall before operating a veterinary practice facility be required to register the facility under these Rules.

No person shall operate a facility without obtaining registration of the facility under these Rules.

Without prejudice to sub-rule (1) and (2), a foreign Veterinarian shall before operating a veterinary practice facility be required to indicate in writing a local partner who shall be working with him.

For the purpose of sub-rule (3) "a local partner" means any registered Veterinarian who is not a foreign veterinarian.

Types of Veterinary facilities

- **25.**-(1) The Veterinary practice facilities shall be in various categories and types as indicated in the Third Schedule to these Rules.
- (2) The Council may, where necessary prescribe any other type or category of Veterinary facility which is not prescribed in the Schedule

Procedure for application

- **26.**-(1) A person who wishes to register a veterinary practice facility shall obtain an application form from the Registrar upon payment of such application fee as may be prescribed.
- (2) An application form under sub-rule (1) shall be in the form prescribed in the Fourth Schedule to these Rules, and shall contain:
 - (a) personal particulars of the applicant;
 - (b) name and address of the owner of the facility;
 - (c) type or category of facility;
 - (d) name address and location of the facility.
 - (e) type of animal health service to be provided;
 - (f) number of personnel involved and their qualifications;
 - (g) such other information as may be required.
- (3) Besides the application form under sub-rule (1), the applicant shall be required to submit to the Registrar a copy of his certificate of registration obtained under these Rules.

Inspection team

27. The Registrar shall after receiving an application for registration of facility under rule 26 appoint the Inspection team of not less than two and not more than three members to inspect the veterinary practice facility.

Inspection fee

- **28**.-(1) An applicant for registration of facility shall, before the inspection of the facility be required to pay to the Registrar such inspection fee as may be prescribed.
- (2) Where the applicant has not paid the inspection fee as prescribed no inspection of the facility shall be effected.

Duties of inspection team

- **29.**-(1) The Inspection team appointed under sub-rule (1) shall after inspection of the facility, prepare an inspection report to be submitted to the Registrar.
- (2) The Inspection report under this rule shall be made in the form prescribed in the Fifth Schedule to these Rules and shall contain -
 - (a) findings of inspection team; and
 - (b) recommendations of the inspection term in respect of the facility.

Reference of matter to the Council

- **30.**-(1) The Registrar shall after receiving the report from the inspection team prepare and submit a brief report before the Council.
- (2) A brief report prepared by the Registrar under sub-rule (1) shall contain:
 - (a) particulars of the applicant and of the facility in question;
 - (b) the recommendation of the inspection team in respect of the facility and
 - (c) recommendations made by the Registrar.

PART VII PROCEDURE BEFORE THE COUNCIL

Determination by Council

- **31.** The Council may in determining the matter presented before it by the Registrar:-
 - (a) decide that the facility in question be registered; or
 - (b) order that more information or details in respect of the facility be obtain from the applicant;
 - (c) refuse the application for registration of the facility and instruct the Registrar to notify the applicant accordingly stating the reasons for the decision of the Council.

Certificate of registration

- **32.**-(1) Where the Council grants registration in respect of the facility under rule 31, it shall instruct the Registrar -
 - (a) to register the facility in question; and
 - (b) issue a certificate of registration in respect of the facility.
- (2) The Certificate of registration to be issued under this rule shall be in the form prescribed in the Fifth Schedule to these Rules and shall contain:
 - (a) the name, address and location of the facility;
 - (b) type of the facility;

(c) such terms and conditions to be observed by the applicant.

Registration fee for facilities

33. The applicant whose registration of facility is granted under rule 32 shall upon registration be required to pay such registration fee in respect of the facility as may be prescribed.

Validity of certificate of registration

34. The Certificate of registration of the facility issued under these Rules shall be valid as long as the annual retention fee is paid and shall be subject to renewal after five years or to such other period upon application by the holder.

PART VIII RENEWAL AND CANCELLATION OF CERTIFICATE OF REGISTRATION

Renewal of Certificate of registration

- **35.**-(1) A certificate holder may, after expiry of his certificate, apply for renewal of the certificate to the Registrar upon payment of non refundable prescribed fee.
- (2) Application for renewal under sub-rule (1) shall be made in the form prescribed in the Sixth Schedule to these Rules and shall be accompanied by:
 - (a) a copy of the expired certificate; or
 - (b) any other documents as may be required.
- (3) The Registrar shall, after receiving the application for renewal of certificate of registration from the applicant under this rule, prepare a brief report for submission to the Council for determination.
- (4) Where the application is made for renewal of certificate of registration of the facility, the Registrar shall before referring the matter to the Council appoint the inspection team to inspect the facility in accordance with rule 27.
- (5) The Council may, in determining the matter submitted to it by the Registrar under sub-rule (3),
 - (a) grant the renewal of certificate of registration and instruct the Registrar to issue a new certificate to the applicant; or
 - (b) refuse an application and instruct the Registrar to notify the applicant the reasons of the Council for its decision.

Cancellation of certificate of registration

- **36.**-(1) The Council may, where the holder of certificate of registration fails to observe the terms and conditions imposed on him, cancel the certificate of registration any time before the date of expiry.
- (2) Where the certificate of registration is cancelled by the Council under this Rule, the certificate holder shall with effect from the date of cancellation of his certificate -
 - (a) stop to practice as a Veterinarian in Tanzania Mainland;
 - (b) close the veterinary facility if any.

Procedure for

37.-(1) The Council shall before cancellation of the Certificate of

cancellation

registration under rule 36 instruct the Registrar to write a notice requiring the certificate holder to make representation to the Council within thirty days from the date of Notice as to why the issued certificate of registration should not be cancelled.

- (2) Where the certificate holder fails to make representation within the period specified in the Notice, then the Council shall -
 - (a) proceed to cancel the certificate of registration;
 - (b) order the removal of the name of the Certificate holder or the facility in the register book;
 - (c) require the certificate holder to stop veterinary practice in Tanzania Mainland.
- (3) Where a certificate holder has submitted his representation to the Council as required under sub-rule (1), the Council shall consider the representation and determine the matter accordingly.

PART IX REVIEW AND APPEAL

Right of appeal

38. Any person who is aggrieved by the decision of the Council under these Rules shall have the right to appeal to the Minister.

Procedure for appeal

- **39.**-(1) An applicant -
- (a) whose application for registration or renewal of certificate of registration is not granted; or
- (b) whose certificate of registration is cancelled, may within thirty days from the date of the decision of the Council appeal against the decision of the Council.
- (2) An appeal under sub-rule (1) shall be filed to the Minister together with a copy of proceedings and decision of the Council.
- (3) The Minister shall after receiving an appeal under sub-rule (2) consider the matter and may -
 - (a) vary or affirm the decision of the Council;
 - (b) require the Council to revise or review its decision:
 - (c) require the Council to inquire for specific information from the applicant for further consideration and decision.

Appeal on review

- **40.** (1) Where an applicant is still not yet satisfied with the decision of the Council on review under sub-rule (3) of rule 39, he may appeal to the Minister against the decision of the Council.
- (2) The applicant shall in filing an appeal to the Minister under sub-rule (1), enclose -
 - (a) a copy of proceedings and original decision of the Council;
 - (b) a copy of the decision of the Minister;
 - (c) a copy of proceedings and decision of the Council after reviewing the matter.

Decision of the

41. The Minister shall within thirty days from the date of receiving an

Minister to be final

appeal from the applicant, consider and determine the matter and his decision shall be final.

PAT X MISCELLANEOUS RULES

Inspection of documents

42. Any person who wishes to inspect documents in respect of any registered veterinarian may upon payment of prescribed fee to the Registrar be allowed to inspect the documents.

Letters of recommendations

- **43.** (1) Any veterinarian who requires a letter of recommendation from the Council, shall apply to the Registrar stating the reasons for such recommendations.
 - (2) The Registrar shall, after receiving an application under sub-rule (1)
 - (a) write a letter of recommendation in respect of the applicant; and
 - (b) requires the applicant to pay such fee as may be prescribed.

License to operate veterinary business

44. Notwithstanding the provision of these Rules a certificate holder shall before he commences the veterinary business be required to obtain business licenses from licensing authorities under other written laws.

Offences

- **45.**-(1) Any person who,
- (a) engage oneself in practice as veterinarian in Tanzania Mainland without registration, or
- (b) for the purpose of obtaining registration,
 - (i) produce any false documents; or
 - (ii) makes false statement to the Registrar,

commits an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred US Dollar or its equivalent in Tanzanian shillings, or to imprisonment for six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

- (2) Any person who operates a veterinary practice facility without obtaining registration of the facility under these Rules commits an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding USD 1000 or its equivalent in Tanzania Shillings or to imprisonment for six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.
- (3) Any person who contravenes a provision of these Rules commits an offence and shall on conviction be liable to a fine not exceeding USD 200 or its equivalent in Tanzanian Shillings or three months imprisonment or for both.

Revocation of G.N.No.433 of 1958

- **46.** (1) The Veterinary Surgeons (Registration) Rules, 1958 are hereby revoked.
 - (2) Notwithstanding the revocation of the Rules under sub-rule (1), any

veterinarian who obtained registration under the revoked rules shall be deemed to have been registered under these Rules.

(3) The Council shall determine the manner in which registered veterinarians under the revoked Rules shall be re-registered.

THIRD SCHEDULE

CATEGORIES AND TYPES OF VETERINARY PRACTICE FACILITIES

A. VETERINARY PRACTICE CATEGORIES:

1. VETERINARY HOSPITAL (MIXED PRACTICE)

A veterinary hospital is an institution suitably located, constructed, organized, managed by Veterinarians or veterinary Specialists to supply scientifically, economically, efficiently all or part of requirements for the prevention, diagnosis and treatment of medical and surgical conditions.

2. VETERINARY CLINIC

A Veterinary clinic is an establishment whereby animal patients are admitted for examination, diagnosis, treatment and carrying out of medical and surgical procedures that require the use of general anaesthesia under the care of registered Veterinarian(s). A clinic can be:

- (i) Veterinary Clinic (Small animal practice)
- (ii) Veterinary Clinic (Large animal practice)
- (iii) Veterinary Clinic (Mixed Practice)

3. VETERINARY CENTRE

A Veterinary Center facility means an establishment where patient animals are admitted for examination, diagnosis and where minor treatments are carried out without the use of general analgesia and without housing.

4. VETERINARY AMBULATORY SERVICE.

A veterinary ambulatory or mobile service facility means a mobile veterinary clinical service provided by using a vehicle, which is equipped with appropriate apparatus, medicine, and adequate diagnostic equipment for the purpose of attending clinical case at farm or on house calls by a registered Veterinarian.
